### 4.0 Peebles Town Action Plan (Place Planning)

The Peebles Placemaking HQ is set up in the Meeting Room at The School Brae Hub and is used it to collate all the background material and feedback from community engagement events. An Open Forum event took place on 1st April in the MacFarlane Hall which was not well attended. However, it did generate many new ideas and was therefore judged a success. Three discussion roundtable events were also held in The School Brae Meeting Room. The writer provided support to Crick Carlton on all four events.

### 5.0 UCL Cycling World Championships.

An online meeting was held to inform communities of the size and implications of the event. Undoubtedly, it is a great honour for the area and should generate an expansion of tourism both in the short and long term. This writer considers that the organisers appear professional and with SBC and other agencies are trying to minimise disruption and effectively manage environmental and health and safety issues.
