# **Community Sergeant Update**

April has been a busy month for Community Policing with the beginning of the various events that take place across the Borders over the spring months, including the common riding appointment nights and policing the rugby seven's tournaments. Officers are working hard to engage with those in the community to ensure the smooth running of these events and we would welcome any feedback that is received by the community councils.

### **Local Policing Priorities**

- 1. Protecting most vulnerable
- 2. Reducing violence and Anti-Social Behaviour
- 3. Reducing acquisitive crime

### **Protecting most vulnerable**

In April 2023 Police in the Scottish Borders attended and were involved with around 153 mental health related calls, around 32 missing person enquiries and approximately 80 domestic related incidents.

Tweeddale East and West had 18 mental health related calls and 3 missing person enquiries. Due to GDPR and protection of victims/subjects involved, we are unable to share any more specific information in relation to these type of call within this report.

Police Scotland work in collaboration with key partners to assist the most vulnerable within the communities and to provide support.



#### Assaults

Between 6<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> April a total of four minor assaults on youths were reported to police having occurred in and around Victoria Park, Peebles. Persons responsible have been reported.

22/04/23 a report was received regarding a youth being assaulted in Hall Street, Innerleithen. The person responsible has been charged.

#### **Anti-Social Behaviour**

04/04/23 – Report of youths knocking on doors in Waverley Road, Innerleithen. Officers attended and found no trace of the youths.

07/04/23 – Report of youths causing a nuisance in School Brae, Peebles. Officers attended and the youths were walking back and forward to the Fun Fair which was in Victoria Park, Peebles.

10/04/23 – Report of youths hitting windows in Waverley Mills, Innerleithen

13/04/23 – A female was detained in custody for various offences including Police assault after an incident at a property near Peebles.

15/04/23 – Report of youths causing a disturbance on Tweed Green/School Brae, Peebles. Officers attended and could find no trace of the youths.

18/04/23 – Report of youths causing a nuisance in Waverley Road and Waverley Mills, Innerleithen

On Friday, 21<sup>st</sup> April a number of calls were received regarding youths on Tweed Green, Peebles. The youths were celebrating leaver's day from Peebles High School. Officers engaged with the youths who on the whole were well behaved, however a male was detained and enquiries are continuing to trace other offenders.

23/04/23 – Report of youths on the roof of West Linton Primary School.

#### Vandalism

During April there have been reports of youths damaging items within the Community Garden, Kingsmeadows Road, Peebles.

11/04/23 – Report of damage being caused to the Bus Shelter which is situated on the A702 in West Linton.

17/04/23 – Report received that the polytunnel at Kingsland Primary School was damaged during the early hours of the morning.

21/04/23 – Report received that a windows was smashed at a property in Bridgegate, Peebles.

Between 21/04 and 24/04 two windows were damaged at the rear of the Citizens Advice Office, Newby Court, Peebles.

#### Killed or Seriously Injured

There were no accidents where persons were killed or seriously injured.

#### **Road Traffic Offences**

02/04/23 – Officers stopped a vehicle in Station Bank, Edinburgh Road, Peebles for having no insurance. The vehicle was seized.

02/04/23 - A driver was issued a fine and penalty points for using a mobile phone while driving in Peebles.

03/04/23 – A driver had his vehicle seized in Queen Street, Innerleithen for no insurance.

07/04/23 – A driver was issued a find for having an inoperative horn on the A703

08/04/23 – Enquiries are continuing regarding a driver who was stopped on the A72 at Thornielee for drink/drug driving.

12/04/23 – A driver was issued with a Fixed Penalty Ticket for driving without an MOT on the A72 in Skirling.

13/04/23 – a driver was issued with a fine and penalty points for careless and inconsiderate driving in Broughton.

# **Tackling Serious and Organised Crime**

## Campaigns

#### **Keep Safe Initiative**

Primarily aimed at disabled members of the community helping to tackle disability hate crime, Keep Safe is a national network of over 800 safe places (including shops, libraries, pubs etc.) for anyone who may feel lost, scared or vulnerable when out in the community. <u>About Keep Safe (iammescotland.co.uk)</u>

All Scottish Borders Co-ops have signed up to the scheme with staff training, business packs and store signage being provided.

#### **Divisional Domestic Abuse campaign**

Regular social media posts highlighting local (DAAS) and national helpline contact details and reporting mechanisms

Ongoing engagement with main local employers to share campaign messages, information in relation to local support services and charities and prevention messages targeting perpetrators directly.

#### Rural

Scottish Borders Partnership against Rural Crime (SBPARC) the partnership continues to meet regularly to address local priority rural crime throughout the year.

#### No Cold Calling Zones

- A new Zone has been set up in Eddleston covering 120 Houses Road signs and house-packs have been provided.
- Implementation work is ongoing with Bowden and Newtown St Boswells community councils for zones in these areas.

## CAT Update:

ROAD SAFETY – SBCAT conducted 2 high profile road safety static check points on the A68 near to Lauder and Jedburgh, working in partnership with our colleagues in Roads Policing as well as the DVSA. This resulted in numerous vehicles being issued with immediate and temporary prohibition orders on the their vehicles due to various mechanical defects being identified, 1 vehicle being seized for having no insurance and a number of other road traffic offences being identified and dealt with either by means of fixed penalty ticket or via report to the Procurator Fiscal. Further to this, SBCAT have issued 14 traffic tickets throughout the month. Further partnership work is underway with DVSA to establish this as a more regular occurrence. Work also being undertaken with Youth Engagement Officer in Peebles to address speeding concerns at Kingsland Primary School, looking to enlist Junior Road Safety Officers to assist with speed checks to raise profile of issue.

PARKING TICKETS – SBCAT have been carrying out high visibility patrols in Peebles, Kelso, Selkirk and Hawick, and addressing parking concerns there. 27 parking tickets were issued in April targeting areas of concern raised by members.

RURAL ACQUISITIVE CRIME – 18 static checks were carried out throughout the Scottish Borders in April at all times of day to deter and detect rural acquisitive crime, leading to intelligence being gathered.

DRUG ENFORCEMENT – 4 drug search warrants were carried out in April in Galashiels, with 2 of them providing positive results. A further person has also been reported for drug possession offences after being stopped and searched by officers.

PROTECTING VULNERABLE PEOPLE – Part of the SBCAT role is to trace persons wanted on warrant. In April SBCAT traced and arrested 6 persons wanted on warrant. We were also proactive in enforcing persons released on bail curfews, with 5 bail curfew checks carried out in April. SBCAT have also assisted colleagues in Response policing with searching for High Risk missing persons in April.

ANTISOCIAL BEHAVIOUR – High visibility patrols have continued in Burnfoot Industrial Estate, Peebles, Market Place, Selkirk, Newtown St. Boswells and at the Galashiels Interchange to address concerns at these locations. Hoax call stickers have been created and placed phone-boxes in the Burnfoot in an attempt to deter persons from misusing the 999 system. 3 youths have been reported for disorder offences at the fun fair in Peebles. A further 4 youths have also been reported to Youth Justice for disorder caused at the fun fair at Galashiels. 6 youths were issued warning letters for

antisocial behaviour caused at the old Border College, Galashiels. Officers in Galashiels have been in dialogue with staff at Galashiels Interchange to establish better working practices for CCTV being made available for officers to assist in the identification of offenders.
