Community Sergeant Update

The start of summer and warmer weather will see people spending more time outdoors and the temptation will be for some to cool off by swimming outdoors in one of the many open bodies of water which we have in our area. The consequences of <u>not</u> acting responsibly around water ways can be fatal. The most recent statistics from the National Water Safety Forum show that in 2021 a total of 277 people lost their lives to unintentional drowning in the UK of which 57 were in Scotland. With this in mind between 18th-25th June Police Scotland will launch its Drowning Prevention Week. This will see officers out and about patrolling areas with bodies of water and chatting to the public about water safety.

Safety is a serious issue at reservoirs as while the water may look harmless there are hidden dangers. Parents in particular should keep their children safe and act responsibly around all water courses. Deep cold water is a particular danger at reservoirs with dams, steeps banks and underwater pipework presenting real hazards. Publicly owned reservoirs are situated in remote locations where there may be a lack of immediate assistance if an incident occurs. Also mobile phone reception can be poor limiting ability to contact help promptly.

Take responsibility for your own actions and makes sensible decisions to stay around waterways:

- Be aware of the dangers, think about the risk and plan to minimise them
- Never underestimate the current, depth or temperature of the water
- Never get into the water alone and don't go swimming after drinking alcohol.

You will note some changes to the layout of the Multi-member ward reports which have been implemented in consultation with the Local Area Commander. The reason for these changes is to reduce the overall size of the document with one notable change being the removal of the table of crime statistics. To replace this the below link gives access to the agenda and related documents for the Police, Fire and Rescue and Safer Communities Board which sits every quarter at Scottish Borders Council.

Protecting most vulnerable

In May 2022 Police in the Scottish Borders attended and were involved with around 180 mental health related calls, around 18 missing person enquiries and approximately 83 domestic related incidents.

Tweeddale East and West had 21 mental health related calls and 2 missing person enquiries. Due to GDPR and protection of victims/subjects involved, we are unable to share any more specific information in relation to these type of call within this report.

Police Scotland work in collaboration with key partners to assist the most vulnerable within the communities and to provide support.



Reducing Violence and Anti-Social Behaviour

Assaults

03/05/22 report received regarding an assault and dangerous driving that occurred on the A702 at West Linton. Further enquiries being carried out.

07/05/22 report of male being assaulted in Peebles Road, Innerleithen – for further enquiry.

Anti-Social Behaviour

01/05/22 report of a disturbance at a property in Kingsland Square, Peebles. Officers attended and a male was arrested and charged with various offences including assault

and misuse of drugs. He was kept in custody until sober and will be reported for summons.

01/05/22 report of youths throwing cones about in Kingsmeadows Car Park, Peebles. Officers attended and found no trace of the youths and no damage.

06/05/22 a report was received that there were a large number of youths in School Brae, Peebles drinking and intoxicated. Officers attended and found no trace of any youths and there were no further calls.

07/05/22 report of a noisy party taking place within a property on High Street. Officers were present at the time of the call and no noise or party was taking place.

07/05/22 report of males fighting within licensed premises on High Street, Peebles. On officers attending the males had left.

13/05/22 report of youth causing a nuisance within Play Park in Victoria Park, Peebles. No trace of youths on officers attending.

14/05/22 report of youths drinking in Hay Lodge Park, Peebles and concerns for a female who had fallen. Scottish Ambulance Service contacted who on attending could find no trace of the youths or the patient.

20/05/22 report of a male playing loud music through a housing estate in the early hours. Male traced and warned.

22/05/22 a report was received early afternoon that youths were causing a damage in Whitestone Park. No trace of youths on police arrival and no damage found.

Vandalism

18/05/22 report from Historic Scotland that a fence had been damaged at the Cross Kirk, Peebles on 13/05/22.

18/05/22 report of theft and vandalism to boats and oars at Talla Reservoir.

26/05/22 report that the poly tunnel at West Linton Primary School had been damaged.



Reducing Acquisitive Crime

Theft by Housebreaking

23/05/22 report that a property at Cardrona had been broken into and two vehicles stolen.

Theft

02/05/22 report of diesel having been stolen from a tank at a rural property in Broughton.

08/05/22 report of a quad bike having been stolen from a rural property in Eddleston. The bike was found shortly after the theft having crashed near Leadburn. Further enquiry.

08/05/22 a youth was caught stealing from a retail premises in Peebles– further enquiries being made.

11/05/22 report of a child's scooter being stolen from outside the shop in Glen Road, Peebles

Between 13/05/22 and 16/05/22 diesel was stolen from council vehicles construction the new cycle path adjacent to the A703.



Improving Road Safety

01/05/22 a motor cyclist has been reported for careless driving on the A72 near Cardrona.

05/05/22 a driver was issued with a vehicle ASB warning after overtaking when unsafe to do so on the A72 at Eshiels.

08/05/22 a driver was issued a fine for driving without an MOT in Peebles.

11/05/22 a driver has been reported for dangerous driving on the A703.

21/05/2022 a driver was issued a fine and penalty points for careless/inconsiderate driving on A703 at Eddleston.

29/05/2022 a driver was issued a fine and penalty points for careless/inconsiderate driving on B712

Killed or Seriously Injured

There were no accidents where persons were killed or seriously injured.

Campaigns

Divisional Domestic Abuse campaign

Regular social media posts highlighting local (DAAS) and national helpline contact details and reporting mechanisms.

Ongoing engagement with main local employers to share campaign messages, information in relation to local support services and charities and prevention messages targeting perpetrators directly.

Rural

Scottish Borders Partnership against Rural Crime (SBPARC) the partnership continues to meet regularly to address local priority rural crime throughout the year.

CAT Update:



ANTISOCIAL BEHAVIOUR

SBCAT have carried out patrols in areas where we have reported issues regards youth ASB, in line with tasking from the Oversight committee. This has included high visibility patrols following events associated with the Common Ridings, which will continue throughout the summer.

Additionally, following a report of off-road motorbikes in the Jedburgh area and surrounds, SBCAT deployed on quad bikes alongside conventional vehicles and Roads Policing. Multiple people were traced in Jedburgh with off-road bikes in vans, and were dealt with accordingly.

DRUGS

One property in Coldstream was searched under a Misuse of Drugs Act warrant, one male being reported for possession of controlled drugs. In addition, numerous

persons have been stopped and searched and found in possession of controlled substances, all of whom have been reported to the court.

ROAD SAFETY

High visibility static road checks have been carried out throughout the Scottish Borders in May, which has resulted in multiple road traffic offences being reported, including driving without insurance, use of mobile phone, failing to stop, careless driving, and bald tyres, amongst others. ASB warnings have been issued to several drivers. Particular attention was given to the Berwickshire area prior to and during the running of the Jim Clark Rally to deter 'enthusiasts' from trying rallying for themselves on open roads.
