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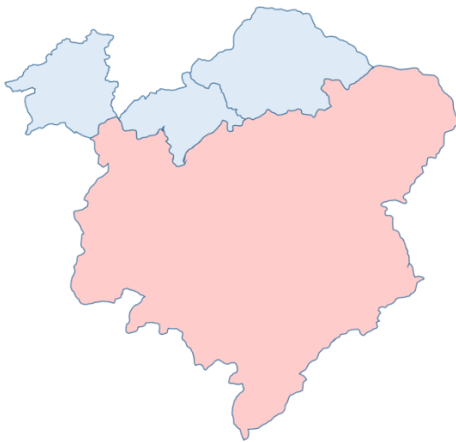

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North Area Community Policing News – PC Gary Beaumont and PC Ryan Shiell

During April 2026, we carried out regular proactive community engagement duties across the area. This included conducting a shoplifting initiative by maintaining a visible presence within local supermarkets that had recently experienced increased levels of theft, providing reassurance to staff and members of the public. As a result, a number of offenders were charged with several offences.

We also attended various local shops on Peebles High Street to distribute and display crime prevention posters aimed at reducing opportunistic crime and supporting local businesses.

In addition, we completed visits to local Brownie groups, engaging with young people and speaking about the role of Police Scotland, community safety, and positive relationships between the police and local youths.

Protecting most vulnerable



In April 2026 Police in the Scottish Borders attended and were involved with around 160 mental health related calls, around 14 missing person enquiries and 106 domestic related incidents.

Tweeddale East and West had 8 mental health related calls 6 missing person enquiries. Due to GDPR and protection of victims/subjects involved, we are unable to share any more specific information in relation to these types of calls within this report.

Police Scotland work in collaboration with key partners to assist the most vulnerable within the communities and to provide support.

Tackling Serious and Organised Crime

Serious and organised crime enforcement – April 2026

The Scottish Borders CID Proactive Unit executed 5 x Drug & General Evidence Warrants during the month of April within the towns of Galashiels, Peebles and Hawick.

In addition to this, proactive vehicle stops have been undertaken. Quantities of Class A, B and C drugs were recovered as well as proceeds of crime.

1 male was reported for proceeds of crime seizure following a cash seizure in Hawick.

1 male has been reported for supply of class B drugs with a quantity of cash also seized.

1 x male found to be in the UK illegally has been arrested for supply of class A drugs seized during a vehicle stop and search in Galashiels.

1 x female has been reported for driving whilst disqualified and no insurance in Hawick.

In addition to drug enforcement, enquiries are being conducted into stolen vehicles from the Berwickshire area that are at this time all believed to be linked.

Serious and organised crime is commonly associated with drug supply; however, it should be highlighted that vehicle crime including thefts, housebreakings and plant theft are all other forms of organised crime often conducted by groups looking to profit from these activities.

Campaigns

Looking for event tickets?

Criminals create fake posts or pages on social media and search engines to scam people looking for tickets or travel deals.

Follow [#TakeFive](#)'s top tips to avoid ticket fraud:

- Stick to official ticketing sites and official resale – avoid buying tickets on social media
- Double check there are no small changes or errors in the web address
- Look for the padlock symbol and 'https' in the web address: 's' stands for secure
- Use secure payment methods and avoid paying by bank transfer

Sexual Extortion or Sextortion is where criminals manipulate victims into sharing explicit images or believing they have nude images, using them as leverage for extortion.

Online sextortion is a form of sexual blackmail. It involves criminals targeting you through dating apps, social media, text or email and manipulate you into sharing sexual images/videos that they later use to demand payments under threats of public exposure.

Criminals may use a false identity to befriend you online and then threaten to send images to your family and friends.

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Sextortion is Blackmail!
