North Area Community Policing News

Retail Crime has been a priority during October and will continue to be a main focus for our attention on the lead up to Christmas. Community Officers across the Scottish Borders have been carrying out additional patrols and visiting retail premises providing crime prevention advice and assistance where required. Whilst October and November can bring some gloom with dark nights and wetter weather, the annual events of Halloween and Guy Fawkes Night bring some fun for the families in our Communities. Whilst the majority of people enjoy these occasions in a safe manner, there are always a few who will push the boundaries and will cause distress to others. We have a team of officers out each evening over the period tasked with dealing with any reported anti-social behaviour.

You will be aware of a series of fires that took place in Peebles in early October causing damage to several buildings. The culprit was quickly identified and presented to court and whilst none of the buildings affected on this occasion were residential, it is possibly a good time to consider fire safety within our homes. PC Beamont has carried out patrols with the River Tweed Commission to deter and identify criminality on local waterways. Whilst illegal fishing and poaching may be seen by some as a victimless crime, it threatens fragile ecosystems, damage local biodiversity and can harm livelihoods that depend on sustainable angling and tourism.

This is also a great opportunity to share information in relation to criminality with a local partner agency.

PC Gary Beaumont has been the sole Community Police Officer covering Tweeddale East & West for over a year now however he has now been joined by PC Ryan Shiell. Ryan is a very knowledgeable and enthusiastic officer who is a great addition to the team.

Brush Wi' The Law

You may remember that PC Gary Beaumont and PC Viv Carsley who is the local School Link Officer, worked with Tweeddale Youth Action (TYA) during the summer holidays to work with local youths in Peebles and Innerleithen to spruce up some areas that had been graffitied. The officers have again been working with TYA and the youths during the October break collecting litter in Victoria Park. These events present great opportunities for officers to speak to the youngsters in relation to any issues that they are dealing with and to also speak to educate in relation to substance misuse, personal and online safety. Protecting most vulnerable

In October 2025 Police in the Scottish Borders attended and were involved with around 201 mental health related calls, around 16 missing person enquiries and 97 domestic related incidents.

Tweeddale East and West had 12 mental health related calls 2 missing person enquiries. Due to GDPR and protection of victims/subjects involved, we are unable to share any more specific information in relation to these types of call within this report.

Police Scotland work in collaboration with key partners to assist the most vulnerable within the communities and to provide support.

Tackling Serious and Organised Crime

Serious and organised crime enforcement - October 2025

The Scottish Borders CID Proactive Unit executed six Drug & General Evidence Warrants during the month of October within the towns of Hawick and Galashiels. These resulted in the seizures of quantities of Class A and B controlled drugs and five figure sums of cash. Four people were reported for drug related offences during the month.

Serious and organised crime impacts local communities across the Borders and anyone with information on criminal activity are asked to contact Police Scotland on 101, report it at any Police Station or report it anonymously via the Crime Stoppers Charity.

This information can be on any criminal matter but includes an individuals unexplained financial gain or wealth or persons who are vulnerable in our communities and being targeted or exploited by others for any reason.

Campaigns



Consider what you are putting on social media, especially in you are going on holiday or attending weddings, functions or posting pictures with jewellery. Criminals search for this information to create a list of empty houses. Your social media accounts should be set to friends only.



Vehicles

High value cars are particularly vulnerable to theft and criminals will commit a housebreaking to obtain the true key of the vehicle. Where possible park vehicles inside a garage, or at least out of sight from the roadway. Secure the keys inside your property out of sight. Avoid leaving them in obvious locations such as the hallway table or kitchen. Never leave valuables in your car.

Keyless Theft or Relay Theft involves criminals using handheld technology to identify whether a parked car has keyless entry. If the car key is close enough the criminals can amplify the signal and send it to a transmitter which acts as the true key and opens the car allowing it to be driven off. Keep keys and fobs well away from doors and windows and purchase a signal blocker wallet to keep them in.

Always Lock Your Vehicle

Items such as phones, money, laptops and tools can be attractive to thieves and are the everyday items that get left on show in vehicles.

Never leave any items of value in your vehicle on leaving it unoccupied.


Remove items of value from the glove box and leave it open to show that it is empty – this includes vehicle registration documentation.
