Community Sergeant Update PS Stephen Granger



The accelerated easing of COVID restrictions and anticipated further relaxation will see an increase in travel, outdoor socialising, recreation and exercise. As these measures come into place combined with some hopefully better weather there will undoubtedly be an increase in youth related antisocial behaviour in certain towns across the Scottish Borders. Police patrols by Community Policing, SBCAT and our Response Policing Teams to disrupt and detect those responsible has been ongoing and this will continue. I would like to take this opportunity to again ask members of the public to contact police directly to report issues as they occur so that prompt action can be taken.

In this regard I am conscious that those engaged in anti-social behaviour are in the minority and that their behaviour all too frequently reflects badly on their peers who themselves are reluctant to reports matters for fear of repercussions. With this in mind I am keen to increase awareness of a campaign to encourage identification and reporting of ASB which has been launched by Fearless (youth programme of Crimestoppers supported by the Scottish Community Safety Network) on Monday 12th April 2021.

The campaign is based on SCSN's 'The Picture of Anti-Social Behaviour in Scotland' report that was published in 2020, and aims to reassure, educate and empower young people (aged 13-18yrs) in Scotland to talk about ASB and learn more. The campaign will also empower young people to use the **Fearless anonymous service** to report information or suspicions about crime. The hope is that this will lead to an uptake in reports made to police and further information on those responsible. The campaign is supported by Police Scotland but as always Fearless/Crimestoppers prefer to maintain their independent status in order to maximise public confidence in the anonymous aspect of their service. It is likely to be shared widely through local youth groups and high schools in all areas. Further information is available at www.fearless.org and I would encourage all age groups and particularly teenagers in our communities to take the time to look at this.

Finally, as reported in previous months, several communities in partnership with Police and SBC have established No Cold Calling Zones as a deterrent to bogus callers and unscrupulous traders. As a reminder these zones can be set up almost anywhere, can be set up by anyone willing (community council, residents association, neighbourhood watch group) and the only costs involved are signage. Funding options are available and can be discussed with your local Community Policing Team. I would ask that all local communities again consider being proactive in considering this option as a tool in deterring door step crime. Protecting most vulnerable

In April 2021 Police in the Scottish Borders attended and were involved with around 113 mental health related calls, around 31 missing person enquiries and approximately 62 Domestic related incidents.

Tweeddale East & West had 6 mental health related calls and 2 missing person enquiry. Due to GDPR and protection of victims/subjects involved, we are unable to share any more specific information in relation to these type of call within this report.

Police Scotland work in collaboration with key partners to assist the most vulnerable within the communities and to provide support.



Reducing violence and ASB

Assaults

On the 26/03/2021 report of a male being assaulted within woodland near to Leithen Road, Innerleithen. Male juvenile assailant traced, charged with serious assault and reported for prosecution.

On the 31/03/2021 report of a disturbance involving two females being assaulted outside the village hall, Galashiels road Walkerburn. Enquires continuing.

On the 16/04/2021 report of male being assaulted at an address in Witchwood Crescent, Peebles. Enquires continuing.

Anti-Social Behaviour

On 26/03/2021 a report of communication offences via Facebook in West Linton. Enquiries are ongoing.

On 28/03/2021 a report of off roads bikes near to Walkerburn. Police attended but no trace of the bikes.

On 29/03/2021 a report of youths drinking alcohol at the river in Peebles. Police attended, no trace of youths at that time. Further report of youths causing a disturbance in Cardrona. Police attended, traced youths matching description but they denied any involvement, advice given.

On 31/03/2021 a report of a disturbance in Peebles, a male was issued a recorded police warning and taken home.

On 01/04/2021 a report of noise and a Covid breach in Peebles. Police attended, persons dispersed and warned regarding guidelines.

On 01/04/2021 a report of threats by a male in Innerleithen. The male was charged with threatening and abusive behaviour.

On 02/04/2021 a report of youths gathering near the river in Peebles. Police attended, group dispersed, one youth had alcohol seized and a letter will be sent. A further report of youths gathering at West Linton Tennis Club. Police attended, group of over 18's were asked to leave due to the call. A further call to the Tennis Club the following morning, males talking loudly and swearing Report of youths gathering at School Brae, Peebles, Police attended, no trace.

On 03/04/2021 a report of youths chanting football songs and singing in Peebles. Police searched but could not trace the youths.

On 04/04/2021 a report of a breach of Covid regulations near to Romano Bridge, West Linton. Male admitted and was advised accordingly.

On 05/04/2021 a report of persons driving through a forest near to Peebles with no permission. Community Action Team gave area passing attention.

On 05/04/2021a report of off road bikes in the forest near Innerleithen. Police unable to attend due to demand of other incidents ongoing at the time. Location marked for passing attention.

On 05/04/2021 a report of youths making noise in the grounds of West Linton Primary School. No youths on Police arrival.

On 07/04/2021 a report of youths at Peebles Golf Club causing a nuisance. Police attended but no youths were traced.

On 08/04/2021 a report of youths within the grounds of West Linton Primary School. Police attended and engaged with a group of youths. No smashed glass, playing music but not excessively loud. Names were taken and reminded about Covid guidelines.

On 09/04/2021 a report of youths causing a nuisance at the Gytes Leisure Centre in Peebles. Police attended and youths were traced, engaged with and details obtained. No offences detected.

On 09/04/2021 a report of youths jumping out in front of vehicles in Peebles. Police attended, no trace of youths.

On 10/04/2021 a report of youths at the Gytes and Tweed Green in Peebles. Police attended and groups of youths were detected, none of which were intoxicated or matched descriptions passed. No offences. Further call on the 10/04/2021 of youths in March Street, Peebles regarding a possible assault. No complaints.

On 10/04/2021 a report of a covid breach in Innerleithen. Two persons advised to leave and warned.

On 11/04/2021 a report of youths gathering in the Old Town, Peebles, no trace of youths.

On 11/04/2021 a report of off road vehicles in woodland near Innerleithen. Police attended and spoke to persons and advised.

On 11/04/2021 a report of youths throwing items at a house in West Linton. An appointment made for householder to discuss with officers. No crime established, suitable advice given.

On 12/04/2021 a report of youths gathering in North Street, Peebles. No trace of youths.

On 14/04/2021 a report of youths playing loud music in a park in West Linton. Police attended, no trace of youths.

On 16/04/2021 a report of a disturbance in Peebles. A male was arrested and charged with assault.

On 16/04/2021 a report of a covid breach in West Linton. Police attended, 7 persons traced and dispersed.

On 17/04/2021 a report of motor cross bikes in the forest near to Innerleithen. No trace.

On 17/04/2021 a report of persons setting up a wild campsite near to Innerleithen. Police attended and the male left the area. A further call near to Innerleithen regarding a campfire. SFRS attended, controlled fire, no issues.

On 17/04/2021 a report of verbally abusive youths in Peebles. Police attended, park was busy but no youths matching descriptions. Complainer updated. Youth call to Neidpath Car Park, Peebles. Police attended, youths present, not causing issues and no reason to be moved on.

On 18/04/2021 a report of youths being abusive to shop staff in Peebles when refused alcohol. Enquiries are ongoing.

On 23/04/2021 report of gathering in a garden in Peebles. Police attended, no breach of COVID guidelines and no other offences. Advice given.

On 24/04/2021 report of youths gathering and causing ASB in Haylodge Park. Police attended several groups of youths present some of whom made off on arrival. No breach of COVID evident and no criminality established. Youths advised re noise levels/litter and dispersed.

On the 12/04/2021 report of a window being damaged at an address within the Old Town Peebles. Enquires continuing.

On the 14/04/21 report of two fibre glass plant holders being damaged belonging to Peebles Old Parish Church, High Street, Peebles. Enquires continuing.

Improving road safety

Within the Selkirk Sheriff Court Jurisdiction there were 24 parking tickets issued in April.

On 18/04/2021 a driver had their vehicle seized for having no insurance in Walkerburn.

On 19/04/2021 a driver was issued penalty points and a fine for having no MOT on the A72 near Thornilee.

On 23/04/2021 report of speeding vehicles in High Street Peebles and nearby streets. Area searched with no trace and extra attention provided which will continue.

On 24/04/2021 motorist charged for driving with no insurance Edinburgh Road, Peebles.



Tackling serious and organised crime

On the 1st April 2021 CID officers from Galashiels executed a General Evidence search warrant at an address in Hawick in relations to recent Business Housebreakings. Large quantities of stolen property were recovered at the address. A male was later arrested and charged with multiple offences and has appeared at Court.

On the 7th of April 2021 officers from Musselburgh Police Station conducted a vehicle stop on the A68, a Drugs Search warrant was thereafter executed at an address in Kelso where over 2000 fake Diazepam tablets and a quantity of Cannabis were found. A Male and Female were arrested and will be reported for the possession of Controlled Substances.

On the 4th of April 2021 following an incident involving someone receiving serious injuries CID officers from Galashiels executed a search warrant at an address in Galashiels. Following a search of the address weapons used in the assault and 18.6g of Heroin with a value of £600 were found within. A male was arrested and appeared at court in relation to the offences.

On the 6th of April 2021 Road Policing officers on patrol on the A7 stopped a vehicle in relation to a criminal investigation. The male driver was found to hold no Driving Licence and was uninsured. A roadside drug impairment test was conducted and the male driver was found to be under the influence of Cannabis. A search of the vehicle found a quantity of cannabis and LSD. The male was arrested and appeared at court.

On 20th of April 2021 SBCAT officers executed a drugs search warrant at an address in Galashiels. A systematic search of the address was completed and 52.5g of Heroin, 34 bags of Chrystal Methamphetamine, Cannabis and 4 TASER Cartridges were found within. A male was arrested at the address and appeared at court.

Campaigns

• National Pedal Protect campaign (Cycle Theft Prevention) - Social Media posts and engagement with local cycle shops with advice posters & leaflets have been distributed.



The National Stalking Awareness Campaign has been supported with SM messaging.



 National catalytic converter theft campaign - Visits to vehicle recyclers / metal dealers across SB to raise awareness have been completed by Police Preventions/Interventions Officer.

Rural

 Scottish Borders Partnership against Rural Crime (SBPARC) agreed that Acquisitive Crime (Thefts from Farms), Responsible Access including Off-road motorbikes and livestock worrying would be initial priorities for the partnership. The partnership will meet regularly to address local priority rural crime throughout the year.



- We continued to post advice on social media and SBAlert regarding Livestock Worrying.
- We continued to distribute free SelectaDNA forensic marking kits & signs to farmers and rural business.

Scams

Scams prevention advice was distributed via SBAlert and Social Media platforms.

Newcastleton Village Public Space CCTV Project

Liaison with Community Council to provide advice regarding system operational requirement and compliance with appropriate legislation.

CAT Update:

ANTISOCIAL BEHAVIOUR – During April the CAT have completed targeted mobile and foot patrols, paying attention to youth hotspot areas including Peebles, Kelso and Eyemouth. Calls in relation to breaches of Covid legislation continue to be recorded, with officers responding accordingly.



DRUGS - CAT have seized class A and B drugs, with an estimated street value of £3360. The CAT team also assisted colleagues in the recovery of Class A drugs with a street value of approximately £250,000.

ROAD SAFETY –Antisocial driving continues to be reported as an issue, and the CAT have carried out patrols of areas of concern. As a result, CAT have issued 21 traffic tickets to drivers for a variety of offences and continue to give attention locations where this behaviour continues.

RURAL CRIME – Night time patrols exclusively targeting acquisitive crime have been carried out to detect and deter those that come into the Borders area to commit crime. These patrols will continue going forward.
